







TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR AN EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FROM POTENTIAL SERVICE PROVIDERS FOR THE PROVISION OF PROJECT MANAGEMENT EVENT SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED FOR THE PROJECT MIKONDZO FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS IN NINE (9) PROVINCES

1. INTRODUCTION

The South African Social Security Agency (SASSA) has been established in terms of the South African Social Security Agency Act, 2004 (Act No.9 of 2004). SASSA is a schedule 3A public entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999, as amended), and is responsible for the management, administration and payment of social assistance.

SASSA invites interested parties to forward their Expression of interest proposals to provide support to Project Mikondzo, which is an integrated service delivery improvement initiative implemented at local municipality level. Project Mikondzo aims to increase the footprint of the Department of Social Development (DSD) and its Agencies i.e. South African Social Security Agency (SASSA) and the National Development Agency (NDA) at local level.

Interested parties should note that the call for an Expression of interest forms part of a short-listing process.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of these Terms of Reference is to provide guidance to interested parties that will respond to SASSA's call for the expression of interest in supporting project Mikondzo. SASSA seeks to accredit 3 to 5 Service Providers per Region that will be accredited to perform this role for a period of 3 years.

3. BACKGROUND

During 2012/13 financial year DSD in collaboration with its Agencies SASSA and NDA visited a number of poor communities (poverty wards and districts with high pockets of poverty and malnourished children) and identified serious challenges on service delivery.

Consequently, project Mikondzo was launched as an initiative that seeks to:

- Monitor social development service delivery at ward level with a view to determine the gap between policy formulation and implementation
- Increase social service foot print/visibility in communities
- Understand the service delivery challenges and backlogs through direct interaction with local stakeholders
- Improve and accelerate DSD, SASSA and NDA services that have been identified to be lacking
- Review the current DSD Service Delivery model
- Strengthen integration (intra and intergovernmental integration including municipalities)
- Appraise interventions by DSD and its Agencies plus partner (NGO's) contributions
- Develop a comprehensive Integrated Service Delivery Improvement Plan
- Develop a business case for the resourcing of integrated services by DSD and its Agencies

SASSA seeks to enlist Service Providers who will assist in achieving the above mentioned objectives for Project Mikondzo by providing the following services:

- o Recruit, train, manage Youth Workers
- o Conduct the household profiles
- o Capture, Consolidate and provide an analyzed household profile report
- o Provide the logistics of the community mapping and household profiling
- o Assist with the community mobilization programme
- o Provide the logistics at the community dialogues
- o Provide the logistics at the Ministerial Outreach Event

4. SCOPE

The accredited service providers will be required to cover the following areas:

- Recruit, train, manage Youth Workers that will be utilized in the identified wards:
 - Recruit and appoint members from the local youth sector, with matric certificate, throughout 9 Provinces
 - An accredited Service Provider/s will provide services within the Mikondzo operations in the Province (s) which they resides.
 - Train the recruited personnel on the policies of DSD, SASSA and NDA and management of all relevant tools for the project in conjunction with SASSA
- In the absence of a living wage in South Africa (only in Agriculture and for domestic workers) and considering the nature of work the recruited youth will doing as SASSA we made a decision.
- Payment of Youth Workers must be a minimum daily rate of R150 or maximum R3 000 (EPWP rate) on a monthly basis and evidence of work done should be provided:
 - Conduct the household profiles
 - o Capture, consolidate and provide an analyzed household profile report
- Provide community mapping and household profiling in promoting development.
- Assist with the community mobilization programme
- Provide the logistics (catering, sound system, venue or tents, facilitation, etc.)
 at the community dialogues

- Provide support in ensuring that required deliverables are provided at the Ministerial Outreach Event (see 5 below):
 - Develop a detailed work plan for every project according to agreed upon specification and timelines
 - o To provide the relevant documentation and ensure compliance to Joint Operations Committee (JOC) requirements
- Provide feedback at scheduled meetings to confirm the compliance of the services to be rendered
 - outreach programmes, from local suppliers (within the wards where services are rendered, moving outside the local area will be subjected to approval by SASSA which will mostly be informed by non-availability of required services in the local area) which will amongst others include the following: Venues, marquees, chairs, catering, transport, promotional materials, décor, sound, sign language and entertainment, fencing where required etc.
 - The local suppliers should be SMME's, co-operatives and unemployed youth including SASSA beneficiaries
- Ability to respond to special requests, to plan and deliver the entire event, within 10 working days (exceptional cases will be subjected as per SASSA directive)

- Compliance with reporting requirements:
 - o A detailed project implementation plan- prior to approval by SASSA
 - o Consolidated progress report as per event on the project deliverables

 - Log-sheet of problems encountered (with questionnaires and events)
 during implementation of the project
- Reports to be discussed with SASSA and must get CEO's approval before they can be used as final reports.

6. MONITORING AND EVALUATION

- SASSA will at all times inspect established infrastructure before commencement of Mikondzo, dialogues and outreach programmes.
- The overall quality of services provided will at all times be checked by a SASSA designated official, to access whether the agreed standard is complied with.
- SASSA will at all times monitor the state of readiness of the required deliverables throughout until the actual event.

7. RESPONSIBILITIES

7.1. The Potential Service Provider to be accredited must:

- Provide an activity Plan within 2 days, when SASSA issues an order
- Conduct business in a courteous and professional manner
- All activities must be performed in an economically cost effective manner within the agreed timeframes per project
- Comply with all basic conditions of employment, including UIF, PAYE, etc. SASSA shall monitor compliance for the duration of the contract and implement penalties for non-compliance, e.g. payment of staff in line with the relevant Sectoral Determination including payment for overtime work
- Manage the internal disputes among his/her staff which must not affect services to SASSA during the duration of the dispute
- That all equipment utilized do not pose a risk to the event and harm any person

- Comply with Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act no. 85 of 1993)
 and any regulations promulgated in terms of this Act
- Ensure at all time that all specified goods and services are complied with as per SASSA requirement
- Ensure that all work performed and all equipment used on site are in compliance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act no. 85 of 1993) and any regulations promulgated in terms of this Act and the standard instructions of SASSA
- Ensure that all staff working under this contract is adequately trained prior to
 the commencement of the contract. Even the relievers must be fully trained
 before they are deployed to SASSA. The service provider shall be penalized
 for the poor performance of his/her staff. SASSA reserves the right to order
 the immediate removal of a staff member who is poorly performing
- Ensure that SASSA is informed of any removal and replacement of staff. For security reasons, SASSA reserves the right to vet all persons working under this contract
- The service provider must upon arrangement with SASSA familiarize themselves with the project sites prior to commencement of duties
- All information, documents and reports must be regarded as confidential
- Ensure accredited service provider includes vetting process of personnel employed by him/her
- Accredited service provider to ensure safety of personnel operating in his/her employ.

7.2. SASSA will:

- Invite accredited list of suppliers to quote, where after the successful supplier will be issued an order and be required to provide a Project Plan within 2 days
- Manage the contract in a professional manner
- Monitor the service provider services in line with the SLA and specifications provided and invoke penalty clauses against the service provider if there is non-compliance
- Provide appropriate information as and when required and only in situations where it is required by the service provider to fulfill their duties
- Not accept any responsibility for any damages suffered by the service provider or their staff for the duration of the contract
- Not accept any unfair labour practices between service provider and their staff which happen during the execution of the project activities
- Not accept any responsibility for accounts/expenses incurred by the service provider that was not agreed upon by the contracting parties
- SASSA, will if necessary request the removal of a staff member if he/she poses a threat and will request a replacement immediately





1. INTRODUCTION

The South African Social Security Agency (SASSA) has been established in terms of the South African Social Security Agency Act, 2004 (Act No.9 of 2004). SASSA is a schedule 3A public entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999, as amended), and is responsible for the management, administration and payment of social assistance.

In creating a citizen-centred service, SASSA entrenches the Batho Pele Framework as outlined in the White Paper on Transforming the Public Service. 3. OBJECTIVES

- (i) Assess service delivery bottlenecks experienced by citizens in the targeted wards/communities that create challenges to access social assistance services.
